Pastor's Corner



Dearest Sisters and Brothers of Christ,

As we begin the Advent Season, I invite you to slow down, not speed up. To breathe deeply the spirit of Christ and remember the light shining in Bethlehem will change our world.

This Advent, we embark on a journey of faith, illumined by the light of Christ. We will see the birthplace of Christ in a whole new way this Advent season with The Bright Star of Bethlehem weekly series for worship. Each week in this series, family members of all generations will gather together in worship to learn more about what Jesus, the Bright Star of Bethlehem, has to reveal to people of all ages about the blessings of creation, hope, unity and joy he came to bring.

- Week 1: Jesus comes to Bethlehem to be born a star—the Star of Creation, and the ruler over heaven and earth. Worship will revolve around the theme of creation and how each one of us has a special place in God's creation because of Jesus.
- Week 2: Jesus comes to Bethlehem to be the Star of Hope to a people long forsaken. We will talk in worship about how Jesus calms all our fears and gives us hope, even when things look hopeless.
- Week 3: Jesus comes to Bethlehem to shine as the Star of Unity. We will focus on the fact that sin divides us sometimes, but Jesus came to bring peace and harmony back into the world.
- Week 4: Jesus comes to Bethlehem to enlighten the world as the Star of Joy. We will celebrate the joy of knowing that Jesus turns all of our frowns upside down through his birth.

As an Advent giving focus, everyone will be invited to fill a Starfish Food for the Poor box to send to Nicaragua to help complete El Campamento/New Jerusalem village. As we try and pull in the remaining housing funds to get all 37 families moved in by Christmas Food for the Poor has begun construction on the Community Center! Thank you for your continuous support on this project and the beneficiaries. If anyone from our congregation is interested in joining on the community inauguration celebration and mission trip to Nicaragua, we officially have dates, March 12th-16th. You will need to pay for your trip, but it will be well worth it! If anyone is interested please let me know and I can provide you with additional information. This is an open trip to members of any church who have participated in the project and a great opportunity to serve in the country, and build relationships with those whose lives were transformed through this project. What a great way to help shine the light of Christ on this world!

This Advent, we will devote our time to remembering the real reason for the season and for our salvation. This is not just any light, this is the light of Christ, the light that changes everything! Remembering that Jesus is the reason for the season this can be an Advent that shines a bright light!





Pastor Greer is taking a Continuing Educational Trip to the Holy Land in January.

This is designated for a Clergy Pilgrimage, organized through Good Shepherd Travel. January 4-14, 2018 will be a time of intentional reflection and spiritual journey to the places Jesus walked. As part of most pastor's letter of call, congregations are encouraged to support their pastor on continuing education each year, to ensure their pastor is always learning. This is beneficial to your pastor's spiritual health and journey, as well as your own. I plan to bring back exciting stories of my pilgrimage to give inspiration to my teaching, preaching and witness to God's grace and faithfulness.

I will arrive in Tel Aviv and continue on to Tiberius, Nazareth. Then off to the city of Haifa to visit Mount Carmel. This will be a full pilgrimage that will involve visits to: Stella Maris to visit the church of Prophet Elijah, Nazareth, visiting the Basilica of the Annunciation, St. Joseph's Church, and Mary's well. From there we continue our way to Galilee, on the way we visit Cana of Galilee, Capernaum, Caesarea Philippi, Tabgha, site of the multiplication of the fishes and the loaves, Mount of Beatitudes for a time of prayer and reflection. Other visits include, Caesarea Philippi, St. Peter's Primacy. Mount Tabor, Qumran, Jericho, Jerusalem, Qumran, site of the discovery of the Dead Sea Scrolls, Baptism site (Jordan River), Jericho, a float in the Dead Sea. Old city of Bethlehem, The Church of the Nativity, Shepherd's Field in Beit Sahour, Mt of Olives, Gethsemane Mt. Zion, Ein Karem, Old City Jerusalem, Via Dolorosa, Holy Sepulchre • The Western Wall and the Temple Mount, view of the Dome of the Rock and El-Aqsa Mosque.

This is a blessed, sacred journey and I am thrilled to have the opportunity. Through a generous gift from my family, I am humbled to take this voyage to the Holy Land and experience the places we read about in Scripture.
