Dear Family of God,

This summer, as in summers past, our worship schedule has changed and as our worship rhythm transitioned, our hope is to create a chance for UNITY as the family of God. Coming together to be stronger in faith together is vital to living faith. While change can be hard and discomfoting, it is important to create a culture of unified family of God, especially in a world of stress and division. We as the church get to be different; we get to focus on coming together around a shared faith and a gracious God, to worship God, above all other things. We must always remember: We come to worship to praise God and experience the gift of Eucharist (Communion); to remember that we are freed and forgiven of our sins and that we are all children of a most gracious and loving God. When we focus on that, we will truly draw closer to God and grow in faith.

Understandably, many have voiced their concerns about the changes for the summer. Let's face it, we all get comfortable with what we are used to, so it can be difficult to try something new. Yet that is exactly what the Holy Spirit calls us to do as people of faith. When we are open to what God is doing and remain focused on the gift of God's grace and the Sacraments (Baptism and Communion), we will truly be transformed.

With that in mind, I want to keep our focus on the priorities rather than personal opinions and comfort zones (which is easy for all of us to do). There are reasons for why we do what we do and what is most important as a worshipping community. So to help understand those reasons, I wanted to share some information regarding Lutheran worship.



Worship

A foundation of faith for everything we do. (Found on ELCA.org)

For Lutherans, worship stands at the center of our life of faith. Through God's word, water, bread and prayer we are nurtured in faith and sent out into the world.

Connected with and central to everything we do, worship unites us in celebration, engages us in thoughtful dialogue and helps us grow in faith. It grounds us in our Christian and Lutheran roots, while demonstrating practical relevance for today's world.

While some of the approaches to worship may differ from one ELCA congregation to another, we hold certain things in common. Central to our worship life is the presence of God through word and sacrament. The word proclaimed and the sacraments —both Holy Baptism and Holy Communion — are called the means of grace. We believe that Jesus Christ is present in these means through the power of the Holy Spirit. Sometimes we describe worship as a “gathering around the means of grace.”

There is also a basic pattern for worship among Lutherans. We gather. We encounter God's word. We share a meal at the Lord's table. And we are sent into the world. But we do not think about worship so much in terms of what we do. Worship is fundamentally about what God is doing and our response to God's action. Worship is an encounter with God, who saves us through the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ.

So, together, we worship and keep God at the center of our worship experience. Together we are growing in faith and need to come to worship and focus on the gift of God's grace. THANKS BE TO GOD!

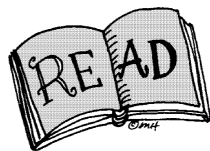
Social Hall Use for Members

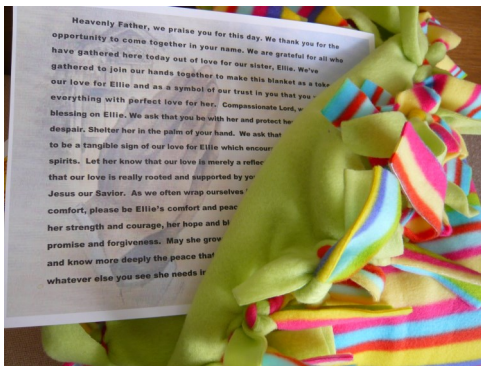

Living Waters Ministries

Is raising funds for Camp Scholarships and YOU are invited to be generous! Living Waters Ministries runs the CHARGE Retreat (our middle school students love and attend!) as well as the GATHERING in Lansing (which our high school youth & young adults attend and love!) The fundraising goal will be done through a Ragnar Relay Run from Muskegon to Traverse City: 12 Runners, 200 Miles, 36 hours in September. It will be run by a team of committed faith leaders from Michigan to raise \$24,000.00 for camp scholarships. Donations received are designated to the LWM Scholarship Fund and will be used for the sole purpose of granting scholarships to campers otherwise unable to attend.
