Dear Priesthood of all believers,

As we embark on the journey toward the 500th Reformation Anniversary, we will focus this Summer and Fall on studying the Catechism, Lord's Prayer, Apostle's Creed and our solid Lutheran Theology. It will be an exciting season of discovery, exploration and deepening of faith. We will share this journey so we can gain an understanding of what it means to be Lutheran as well as, what it is we are remembering when it comes to Reformation Day 2017.

A few things to look forward to. As a community of faith we will be in conversation and study of Luther's Small Catechism that will offer insight into what we proclaim, specifically as Lutherans. We will also engage some creative ways to live out our Lutheran faith in daily life. If we don't practice what we preach, it is for naught. Therefore, we will find confidence in our proclamation, as Luther said, “Here I stand, I can do no other.”

Luther came to reject several teachings and practices of the Roman Catholic Church. He strongly disputed the Catholic view on indulgences as he understood it to be, that freedom from God's punishment for sin could be purchased with money. Luther proposed an academic discussion of the practice and efficacy of indulgences in his *Ninety-five Theses* of 1517. Luther nailed these *Ninety-five Theses* to the church door, where people would often post announcements. His refusal to renounce all of his writings at the demand of Pope Leo X in 1520 and the Holy Roman Emperor Charles V at the Diet of Worms in 1521 resulted in his excommunication by the Pope and condemnation as an outlaw by the Emperor.

This is just a brief introduction to some of the powerful things we will be learning about Luther's bold faith throughout this season of Lutheran theological discovery. Boring, you might think? NOT AT ALL! This valuable theological learning will take place in creative and interactive ways so all ages will be engaged and excited to learn what it means to be Lutheran, why we profess what we do, and the power of the Protestant Reformation. We will be offering opportunities to view the film “Luther” in stages with theological discussion and conversation. If you haven't seen this movie, or if you have, it will be well worth your time to view it again with your community of faith.

Sisters and brothers, this Summer and Fall we will embark on a faith-filled, engaging, theological journey that will enlighten, challenge, inform and empower us to live into our Lutheran identity. I am excited to share this journey and engage Martin Luther's writings and theological understanding of God's grace and abundant mercy. Please come, make church a priority in the midst of your summer and know that the Holy Spirit is moving and active in the blessed community of Amazing Grace Lutheran Church.

Greetings from your Parish Health Team. Anybody ever heard of this? I'm positive everyone is familiar with the word golf and also most of have feet. But when you put them together then we can have a ball, a soccer ball that is. Since it's introduction to America in 1743 golf has been growing in popularity. Soccer also has a long history in the U.S. Colleges began play in 1820. Eventually, in 2009 the two would join forces and become FOOTGOLF. Golf can be serious, challenging and the equipment expensive, but footgolf is just plain fun. It's played on a golf course with a soccer ball and has a few different rules: Use a ball that you can identify as your own; no spikes (wear tennis shoes); soccer balls float so you can get it back if it goes in the water. But you can still wear colorful clothing just like in golf.

Please join us on Sunday, July 23rd right after the 11:00 service for fun and excitement at Red Oaks Golf Course on John R. Road just north of 12 mile road. 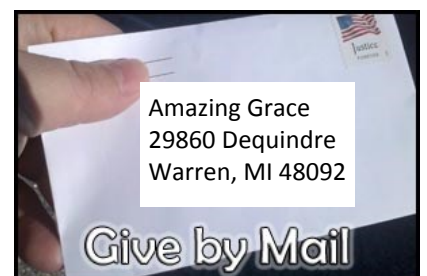

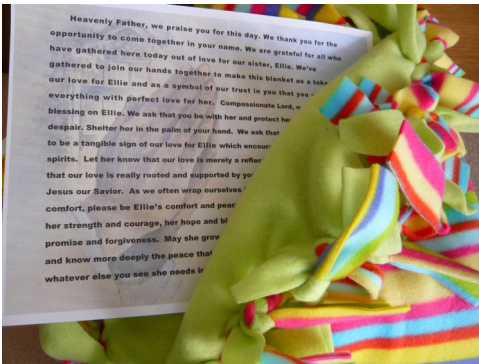
