# **Pastor's Corner**



Dearest Family of God,

Amazing Grace Lutheran Church is a generous group of people! People committed to furthering the kingdom of God. People committed to the life and ministry of this church. People committed to generosity and grace. It is continually amazing how generous this congregation is with time, talent and treasure.

Hearing stories of faithful giving and living are an inspiration to each generation of givers. We are all still learning how faithful giving and living affect our lives as members of the body of Christ. What we do know is that when we give joyfully, God does incredible things. Now, often when we hear about Stewardship we all might cringe a bit or drag our feet. Be honest, it's ok. But does anyone know why we do a stewardship 'drive' in the Fall each year? Historically, the stewardship drive was done in the Fall because it was Harvest time and all the farmers had the bounty from their years' crops and could offer with abundance. But, I don't really know how many farmers we have in our congregation now...so why would we limit ourselves to "Fall Harvest Giving"? What if we lived a year-round kind of stewardship? What if we lived stewardship as a way of life?

That is what we are excited to do this year and in the years to come. To live out of abundance, not scarcity. To practice faithful living and giving as a lifestyle! We will ask that each family or giving unit fill out and return an "Intention to Give" card this November and prayerfully consider how to increase your regular offering. This allows us to grow and continue the life-giving ministries of Amazing Grace. I understand that talking about money and asking for additional giving can be uncomfortable, but I am going to ask anyway. If we are a family together, then we need to take care of our home and have these conversations. We want everyone to grow in their generosity journey! We pray that each giver considers what God calls them to give and lives out of abundance.

Do you know how many Americans tithe or give 10% of their income? Can you guess? Only 13%!!!! So, if you feel called to tithe, then tithe, feel free to give 10% of your income, what a gift! But know that tithing is not an expectation and that is ok. In America, only 0.26% give to the Church and 0.9% of giving does not go to the Church. So, really giving to the church in today's world is rare and unique. Wouldn't it be cool to be rare and unique and challenge the status quo? Wouldn't it be fantastic to be able to increase our congregational giving by 10% this year?

Faithful sisters and brothers, let's raise our budget by 10% and let's try to exceed that goal and really see what God can do with our faithful giving and living! If you have given nothing in the past, please consider giving \$1/day to the Amazing Grace Church family you love and consider that with your gift, you will increase our opportunity to serve by \$365/year. If we all consider giving a little bit more, we can trust that God will do incredible things through these gifts. Let's do this together!





# **Worship Team Report**

Greetings from your Worship Team at AGLC. Your Worship team strives to offer a meaningful and respectful worship experience each and every time! This month we'd like to review "Usher Guidelines." If you wish to join an Usher Team, please contact the church office to do so. Perhaps understanding what this entails will prompt you to offer your time on an Usher Team!

Note: Please arrive at least 20 minutes prior to the scheduled worship service. Bring a contagious smile, please! Each Usher is responsible for notifying his/her captain if he/she cannot serve at a regularly scheduled service.

#### Before Each Worship Service Begins

- Plug in the Baptismal Font. (**Before the 9:00am worship service**)
- Check Grace Notes and set up for any special worship events (baptism Sundays need the shell in the font filled with HOT water.
- Check with Pastor regarding any specific instructions or requests.
- Make sure pita bread and chalice are on the altar.
- Light candles about 5 minutes prior to the service. The Baptismal candle is to be lit during the season of Easter as well as on any Baptismal Sunday.
  - 1. Pause before going up the steps with a slight bow.
  - 2. Light the baptismal candle when appropriate
  - 3. Next light the altar candles from **left to right (extinguish right to left.)**
  - 4. Light candelabras from inner to outer (extinguish outer to inner.)
- Stand by double doors in the narthex, keeping them closed. Open doors for guests when possible.
  - 1. Distribute Grace Notes, which are located on the Usher table in the back of church.
  - 2. Assist seating the congregation as needed.
  - 3. Serve as Greeters. Ideal set-up is when we have at least 4 Ushers! One Usher at the main doorway, one usher by doorway outside the workroom, 2 Ushers by the sanctuary doors.
- Set up extra chairs if needed.

#### After the Service Begins, at Both Services

- Assist seating late comers.
- Make sure ALL back doors are closed and locked (5 sets) after the opening song.
- Count all present in worship before children go to Sunday School, and record the amount on the calendar in the Work Room (outside secretary's office.)
- Walk through building a couple times during the service, and keep a close eye on the main front doors. If unknown visitors come
  in, welcome them.
- One Usher should place the offering plate on the altar, the other Usher is to place the stool behind altar.

#### Communion

- Inform Sunday School it is time for communion during the Offering.
- Use continuous communion for distribution.
- Ushers collecting empty glasses will commune first. The usher(s) letting people out of seats commune last.
- Choir and Praise Team will receive communion first
- At the 9:00 am service, one station, dismiss the right (facing the altar) side out first. At the 11:00 am service we have 2 stations, begin with side aisles, front rows, simultaneously.
- Two Ushers, you may ask children, commune first and hold the empty trays for used communion cups.

#### After the Service

- Extinguish candle during the last song in the *reverse order of lighting*.
- Open each sanctuary door entering into the Narthex.
- Straighten the sanctuary following your service, picking up grace notes and garbage left behind. Sweep up any bread crumbs on the wooden floor where communion was served.
- Attendance Books: After the 11:00 service, remove top page if names have been recorded. Place in secretary's mailbox in the Work Room.
- Following the 11:00 service, turn off lights when majority of congregation has left and be sure to unplug the Baptismal Font!
  - 1. Check and lock all outside doors, which include: Social Hall door to courtyard double doors, In Hallway double doors outside Learning Center, Learning Center small door outside Pastors office, Narthex main doors, door to Narthex.
